1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The College has contributed to the Curriculum Development affiliated to Bangalore University by providing inputs based on the feedback analysis from various sources assessing local, national and global needs. Many senior teachers are the members of Board of studies and Board of Examiners of Bangalore University. Thrust on the development of knowledgeable skills are provided through various programs in the College in addition to value added courses and value based education. The College has diverse range of course options catering to different range of learners in terms of core choices.

Based on the societal demands, the College has introduced BCOM, BBA and BCA courses during the inception of college itself. Add-on courses like Tally, Android, ASP.Net, VB.Net, Python and Digital Marketing leading to certificate have been introduced since three years. Thus, the academic flexibility is ensured for those seeking admissions in the College.

Choice Based Credit System is introduced from the year 2014-15, where multi– disciplinary approach is being followed in higher semester classes. Semester system is followed as per the scheme of Bangalore University. Several compulsory inter-disciplinary subjects are introduced on the topics like Environmental Science and Public Health, Human Rights and Indian Constitution, Personality Development, etc. ICT is integrated in the

curriculum by introducing subject of Computer Fundamentals for UG courses, E Business, Accounting and Computer Business Applications for BCOM and BBA courses. Curriculum Workshops are conducted to discuss the syllabus, preparing the blow-up syllabus and question paper pattern for the benefit of teachers. Teaching pedagogy is followed in the College. Assignments, student seminars, worksheets, field visits, industry visits, Guest lectures are organized for students centered learning methods.

Faculties for some of the career oriented programs have been invited from the industry or research institutions. Several co-curricular activities and commemorative day celebrations such as International Women's Day, Blood Donation festival, Bhashamurutham etc. are being conducted in the College to enrich students with wide variety of co-curricular developments. Gender sensitization, environmental issues, moral and ethical values, better career option and community orientation programs are regularly conducted.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

RNS First Grade College strives for the overall development of students in this highly modernised society. As far as the Teaching – Learning and Evaluation criterion is concerned for NAAC, this criterion is classified into seven points which plays a major role in elucidating individual student's either excellency or of any defaults. It starts with well –administered and transparent mode of student admission following the ratio for reserve category to the programs with all the norms of the concerned regulatory / governing agencies including state and Central Government. It pertains to the efforts of the institution. The students are admitted to the courses of BCOM, BBA and BCA who are from different socio-economic, cultural and educational backgrounds. They are trained with all diversifications there by identified as slow and advanced learners. The opportunities given to exuberate their talents, creative skills, methods, etc.

While giving importance to teaching – learning process, which is referred as Students Centric method. It focusses on learning through experience, participation and problem-solving methodologies.

As per Bangalore University prescribed syllabus with program outcomes, course outcomes are identified and documented carefully for improvisation. With whatever the academic preparation of students, it would be tested and evaluated. The academic report is sent to the parents and also to the University. The Management selects well qualified and experienced teaching faculty who are dedicated for the sake of students' betterment. The students are appreciated and guided not only for their academic progress but also to gain knowledge of sports and cultural aspects as well. The tests and examinations are conducted under the surveillance of CCTV Cameras fixed in all classrooms.

For effective teaching, ICT tools are used by the teachers of all programs. Students' grievances after the tests and examinations in making corrections are also carefully handled by the college and the work is done excellently. The important classification is Student feedback which stands as the prism for a reputed college. The students have been given quality education and also the inculcation of human values. Opportunities are provided to get into this competitive world.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The Management of RNS First Grade College deals with the facilities provided by the institution to promote a research culture among the teachers. Faculty members are encouraged to write research papers, books and book chapters. the institution organises special lectures/seminars on writing research papers with the main objective

to expand the knowledge base. The Management gives the latest information and builds credibility; thereby improvising discernment. The faculty learn to empower students to take responsibility for their happiness and success. Practical classroom strategies can be used in classroom tomorrow to understand the students' reaction when faced with difficult College courses and to explore classroom issues that impede students' success and to learn dealing with them.

The research activity conducted by the lecturers of various departments in the College, like Commerce, Business Administration and Computer Applications, were notified on the UGC website that enhanced the exhaustive knowledge. Many books and chapters in edited books were published and the papers in National/International Conference proceedings by every faculty in the department.

Some extension activities were carried out in the neighborhood community like: Vote for India, Aids awareness, Blood Donation festival, Women Empowerment in Digital India, Awareness on Cleanliness, Orphanage and old age home visits, Yogathon, Eye Check Up and Eye donation Virtual Pledge. Most of the extension and outreach programs were conducted by the institution through NSS during the last five years. The average percentage of students' participation in extension activities was calculated. The college has received awards in all these years for their commendable work in extension activities such as Blood Donation festivals, Blind camps, etc.

A number of functional Memorandum of Understandings were fixed with industries, corporate houses during the last five-years to promote practicality in learning academics. To provide industrial exposure to the students and faculty for guiding them to upgrade to the new technologies. A MOU is signed between the College Corporate houses, industries etc. To be the ultimate, RNS First Grade College has etched a mark in Guinness world record by creating Clay models of lord Ganesha vigraha.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Physical Facilities

This section describes the physical and infrastructure facilities of RNS First Grade College like classrooms, classrooms with ICT facility, sports facility, auditorium, seminar hall, library, computer labs, ramps, solar panel, rain water harvesting plant, sewage water treatment plant, etc. The College is facilitated with well-equipped sports room in the basement. The sports activities have begun the College from the time of inception. carom, chess, table tennis, and badminton etc are all the parts of indoor sports activity. For outdoor field events the College has been facilitated with ground. Yoga and Gymnastics are the vital parts of the sports activity which has been recognized at the international level.

Library as a Learning Resource

The library has a good collection of subscribed books. Journals, magazines and newspapers. The library uses open source integrated library management system software called 'KOHA'. The library has started using institutional repository software called "DSpace." It is used for creating open access repositories for scholarly and published digital content. The library has subscribed e-resources databas called N-list and DELNET. It possesses Bangalore University library membership to benefit the users and provides open access resources for the benefit of the users like NDLI, e-PG Patashala, etc.,

IT Infrastructure

The College is well facilitated with Internet facility. Initially it had BSNL network connectivity and later updated to ACT INDIA FIBERNET network. Now WIFI facility is enabled for entire campus which includes classrooms, staffrooms, library, computer labs, business lab, office etc. Computers are enabled with high speed LAN connectivity. Around 250 Mbps is the access speed. This facility has enhanced the progress in teaching-learning aspects of the College.

Maintenance of Campus Infrastructure

The growth, maintenance and regular replenishment of infrastructure facility plays a vital role in the academic development of the institution. The supporting facilities on the campus are developed to contribute to an effective ambience for curricular, extra-curricular and administrative activities. A provision of expenditure in the budget is made annually by the Management for the maintenance and replenishment of physical facilities which will ensure their availability on a continual basis.

Student Support and Progression

RNS First Grade College offers graduate courses like BCOM, BBA and BCA for the students from various socio economic backgrounds. The institution encourages the students to pursue higher education and the College has Placement Cell for guiding students towards a better career and providing job opportunities through campus interviews. Various career guidance workshops, PG CET training sessions and assessment on employability skills are conducted under Placement Cell.

The College takes pride in stating that the students shine in cultural events, sports and inter College fests bringing fame and recognition to the institution. Several co-curricular, extra-curricular and sports activities are being conducted to facilitate a holistic development of the students' to emerge as a socially responsible individual. Several students have excelled in sports. A student has participated in Yoga at International level and a few other students have won prizes and represented the State, University and National level games in different competitions. The College has a Language forum called Bhashamrutham wherein various literary activities like Role Play, Group Discussion, Debate to improve Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing Skills of students.

The College has a Student Counselling Committee, Anti Ragging and Anti Sexual Harassment Committee to note the incidents of sexual harassment. The Student Grievance Redressal Committee addresses the grievances of the students and are aptly dealt by the concerned authority. Equal Opportunity cell caters to create the atmosphere of equal opportunity to all the students from various backgrounds. The institution has student members in various administrative bodies of the college such as a Student Grievance Redressal Committee, Anti Ragging Committee, Anti Sexual harassment Committee, Equal Opportunity Cell and IQAC of the College.

The college ensures the prompt application schedule and payment of SC/ST/OBC scholarship provided by the State Government and the Government of India.

The college facilitates Add-on Courses such as Dot net, Android, Python courses for BCA, Tally and Digital Marketing for BBA/BCOM, to add on skills and increase employability of students. The Alumni of the college have been actively involved in various events of the college like Blood Donation camp and mock campus

drives.

Governance, Leadership and Management

RNS First Grade College was established in the year 2012 by the perceptive endeavours of our founder Dr. R N Shetty. The College is managed by the means of a Governing Council consisting of the members of the Management, prominent academicians and Industrialists. The College administration is decentralized and participatory in nature. The principle of participative management empowers the departments to take decisions on academic matters and implement them with the approval of the Principal. At the institution, human resource has been optimally utilized and managed. They are trained as per the need; encouraged, involved in the process of decision making, motivated as per their aptitude, area of interest and expertise. A total of 32 committees have been formed by the Principal for the smooth functioning of the College. Thus the participative management ensures the total participation of all the concerned people. IQAC is the significant administrative body and the prime duty of IQAC is to initiate, design and oversee the various activities. These activities are required to enhance the quality of the education imparted in the institution.

The College conducts several Seminars/ FDP/Conferences and Workshops throughout the year to enhance the professional development of its teaching and non-teaching staff. The faculty members are also provided with financial support to attend conferences and workshops. The institution has opened a Grievance Redressal Cell. All the faculties and students are free to approach the Cell which comprises of experienced and senior faculty members.

The Staff Welfare Committee works for the welfare and benefit of all the staff with PF, ESI, Gratuity, Maternity Leave etc. welfare measures available for the staff members.

The institution carries out both the internal and external financial audits annually. Internal audit of the institution is carried out regularly by the members of the Internal Financial Audit Committee. External Audit is conducted by the auditors of BC Shetty and Co, at the end of every financial year. The College also ensures budgetary provisions for the various activities which take place in the system.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The main mission of RNS First Grade College is to mould the character and the behaviour of the students to enlighten their career. Educating a girl child, and women development through Women Empowerment Cell is given primary importance.

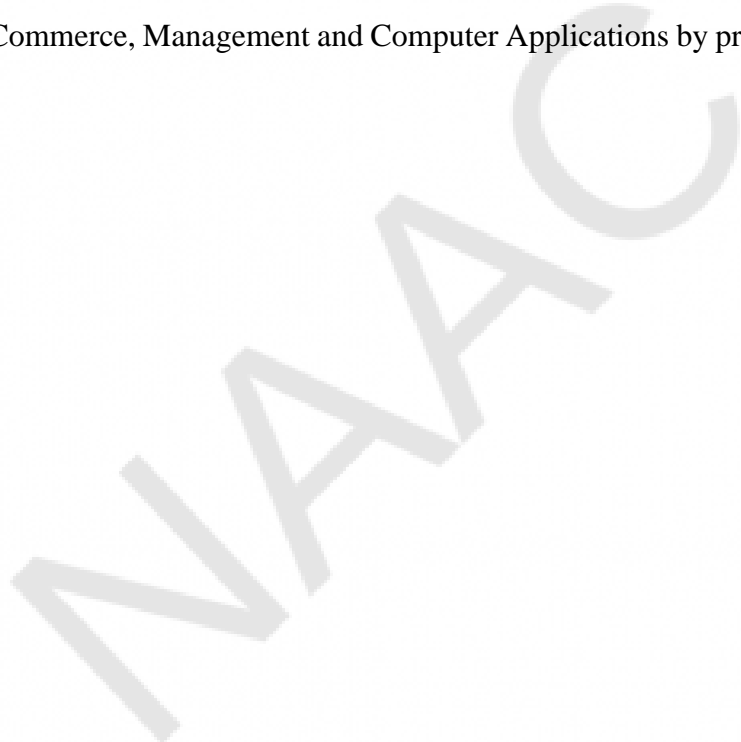
A 485 KW solar panel Electrical power generating facility has been commissioned with appropriate control system to synchronize/tie with BESCO grid. Our college has given greater importance to conserve energy by using only LED bulbs for lighting facilities throughout the building. The College adopts the policy of reduce, recycle and reuse. It has enough staff for the collection of dry waste. Rain water harvesting structure and waste water recycling provision is done in the college premises near the bore wells. The construction of S.T.P. with capacity of 1 MLD is erected by RNS Infrastructure Ltd.

The College has planned for pedestrian pathways. Green practices are conducted every year. Green audit and Environment audit are done through NSS unit. The College celebrates Blood Donation Festival. WALKATHON/YOGATHON is practised to create awareness among people about the importance of yoga.

The College defines its academic and co-curricular activities through its vision to make the centre to deliver quality education; being a benchmark in the field of NSS Programme, Yoga, visit to Old age home and Orphanage, Netrakumbha, Donation to flood victims, Blood Donation Camp, etc. The College celebrates National festivals with great patriotic enthusiasm and motivates the students on the day by giving the significance and respects the sacrifice of the freedom fighters.

The facilities available in the institution are ramps/rails, disabled-friendly washrooms, scribe, human assistance, wheel chair, ambulance service, display board and signposts etc. The college has conducted a number of activities for the students and teaching fraternity; such as promotion of Universal values and many workshops, fests, rallies, and activities on awareness of Constitutional obligations, rights and duties. A special talk is organized on the teachers' day on "Roles and Responsibilities of Teachers".

The college is dedicated to Commerce, Management and Computer Applications by providing a platform for all the young minds.

The HOD arranges departmental meetings to distribute and assign the work allotment. Faculty members prepare semester-wise lesson plan for theory and practicals at the beginning of every semester. The program outcomes, program specific outcomes and course outcomes have been framed in accordance with the regional, national and global needs. They are aimed at equipping the students with a critical and imaginative thinking, effective oral and written communication skills, and ability to use ICT to meet the needs of a complex global society. Various committees are framed for academic as well as co-curricular activities for smooth functioning and betterment of students. The planned Bridge course classes are conducted for a week according to the timetable to make students aware of fundamentals of subjects.

To compete with the technological demands of the modern era, faculty members have been insisted to follow innovative pedagogy of teaching methods like internet, e-notes and LCD projectors apart from chalk and talk. Each teacher is provided with an academic diary. Departmental meetings are held to update the syllabus completed for the effective delivery of curriculum; college integrates class room teaching with various ICT tools such as - Field projects, student seminars, tutorials, question paper sand CRT. The college conducts two internal tests and one preparatory examination every semester. Other than University prescribed syllabus RNS First Grade College, organizes CMCA Campus Yuva Workshop – value added course like “citizenship education and life skill education”, to transfer the young minds to concerned thinking and active citizens. Experts from industry and academia are engaged in developing graduate attributes, educational objectives and learning outcomes for courses and programs keeping in mind the latest trends in education and changing requirements of industry. Value education course familiarizes the students to various social issues and encourages them to pursue and suggest ways to tackle them. Environmental Studies highlights the importance of environmental conservation and sustainable development.

Reward system for students is present for the upgradation of subject-related knowledge. College organizes seminars, conferences and workshops. Best class award is given in each semester. College also provides special guidance to the slow learners under the remedial class coaching. Library provides book-bank facility, e-journals, textbooks, OPAC service, Inter library loan, annual institution membership with Bangalore University and Shodhganga. Our college library has subscribed E-Resources for N-List and DELNET; beneficial for students and faculty. It also provides open access for E-Books, E-Journals National Digital Library in India (NDLI), E-PG Patashala (videos for E-Learners of RNS College). The college also provides 500 mbps internet connectivity within campus; Wi-Fi facility to the students and the

teachers for effective teaching learning. At the end of each semester, college collects feedback on curriculum from all the stakeholders. It is then analyzed and analysis report is communicated to concerned authorities.

Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CIE)

RNS First Grade College, affiliated to Bangalore University follows the norms and conditions of academic curriculum. Keeping in mind the betterment of students and academic progress, every semester the college conducts two Internal Assessment Tests and one Preparatory Exam. Each Internal Assessment Test is conducted for 35 marks and one Preparatory examination for 70 marks and this is practiced every semester. The college has adopted a method of assessing the academic performance of the students on a continuous comprehensive basis. This system of academic practice makes every student to prepare, perform and score good marks.

- The marks allotted for Internal Assessment is 30 (assignment 5 marks, attendance 5 marks, Internal Assessment Test 10 marks and Preparatory Exam 10 marks). The external exam is conducted for 70 marks from Bangalore University.
- After First Internal Assessment test of every semester, the students whose performance is less than 40% and who are slow in grasping and understanding the subjects are added to the remedial classes.
- Slow learners are counselled individually to come out with their defaults towards the low score of marks, to make them open up with their difficulties in registering the particular topic.
- Few topics in particular subjects are thoroughly revised which help students to build confidence and perform better in the next test.
- The students are counselled for their below average performance and are guided on how to improve in their performance in the next exam.
- The students who are good in understanding and focus well on academics are considered for advanced learning and they are encouraged to participate in seminars/conferences and to present papers.
- They are encouraged by the teaching fraternity, especially the Principal, to be an all rounder to score well in all the tests/exams. They are also encouraged to score centum in the domain subjects.
- They are motivated to be the college toppers and University Examination toppers.
- Project is a part of the Internal Assessment curriculum which is included in VI Semester. The Head of the Departments guide all the students related to the projects.
- Students are given guidelines and training even in extracurricular activities like Sports and Cultural competitions.
- Indoor, Outdoor and Inter College sports events and competitions are entertained for the betterment

of students.

- To showcase the hidden talent of students, the cultural events are conducted. For ex: rangoli, mehendi, nail art, collage, pencil sketch, face painting etc.
- To enrich the knowledge of students, club activities, quiz, group discussions and debate are conducted in the college.
- Internal Assessment Test is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and variety. There is complete transparency in conducting Internal Assessment Test, Preparatory Examination with the surveillance of CCTV cameras.
- The marks obtained by the students in Internal Assessment Tests, Preparatory Examination and attendance of each month are displayed on the notice board. The details are uploaded periodically on the college portal along with their attendance status.

2.2 Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Response:

The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes for advanced learners and slow learners.

RNS First Grade College assesses the learning levels of students' right from the admission level. The teaching learning environment in the college is keen to assess the ability of the students after admission. Orientation and Bridge course are arranged for all the students. The effective academic and personal mentoring system helps to identify the advanced and slow learners. After the First Internal Assessment Test, the students' potential is observed. Based on the test performance and other activities the teachers identify the slow learners and advanced learners. Slow learners are the students whose performance is less than 40% in test and are also slow in grasping, registering and passive in participating. Advanced learners are those whose score is above average, register quickly and are also good in co-curricular activities. All the students' academic and overall progress is observed from the beginning. The students are observed based on three criteria:

1. Performance at the Pre-University/12th CBSE exam.
2. The performance in the First Internal Assessment Test, the attendance, involvement in the activities and their responses.
3. Lastly, on the observation basis both in academic and co-curricular aspects throughout the year.

Implementation methods for slowlearners:

Mentors-Mentee interaction:

As the Institution frames the strategy of Mentors – Mentee interaction, the subject teachers of all programs are given the guidelines by the Head of the Institution. The list of mentors and mentees is displayed on the notice board. The respective mentors have one-to-one interaction with the students about the level of their understanding. Any clarification with regard to the subject, difficulty of understanding or any other issue is discussed with the faculty. The mentors take the students into confidence and encourage them to perform well in the tests and examinations.

Steps taken for advanced learners:

- Are provided with advanced study materials.
- Are encouraged to present papers in the conference, workshops and Journals.
- Are encouraged to be the team leaders, thereby develop leadership qualities.
- Are motivated to be the college toppers, University rank holders and to secure centums.
- Semester toppers and University rank holders are felicitated on Fresher's Orientation Programme.
- Are motivated to write articles for the college magazine.
- Are encouraged to represent the college in intra and inter-college competitions.
- Are motivated to set high goals and to chase their dreams.

Steps taken for slow learners:

- Students' cause of problem is identified and required support is provided.
- The Mentor takes the students into confidence and are in constant touch with the students.
- Overall personality development is stimulated.
- Additional assignments, suggestions for improvement and academic problems are addressed.
- They are given more attention at all times.
- Are encouraged to participate in the co-curricular activities.
- Efforts are made to mould them with required skills, to make them more confident and enhance their skills.

2.3 Teaching- Learning Process**2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences**

Response:

The Management of RNS First Grade College strives for the overall development of students. It not only emphasizes with academia but provides equally the great opportunities to explore the students' hidden talents and creative skills in various ways through participation.

The ways are:-to think, to participate, to feel, to solve problems if any and to judge methodically. This whole sort of system shapes an individual to manage time, to develop creative and presentation skills. These are very much necessary to face the challenges in this rapidly progressive world.

The activities are classified into 3 groups.

1. Learning through experience:

Students take part in various class and club activities which indeed develop the mental horizon of the students. The activities are conducted at intra-class and inter-college level. The college conducts various events and competitions for BCOM, BBA and BCA students through “Ignited Minds” and “Cront Club” respectively. The college conducts education tours which give academic information and dissertation work makes students to be confident in particular topics. Add-on courses like Tally, Digital Marketing, Dot Net and Python are provided to shape students’ career to secure job. Industrial visits organized by the management will strengthen the individual student’s mind-set to get into the corporate world.

2. Learn through participation:

The students have been provided with ample number of opportunities to showcase their hidden and creative talent under Bhashamrutham; the language activity committee through participating in various activities like; Role play-The noble characterization to be enacted on the stage extracted from the great works of popular playwrights and dramatists which constitutes proper delivery of the dialogues. Story Writing improves the ability of language skills. The activity, Quiz improves the general knowledge in various subjects. Debate checks the proper way of presentation on the given topic and Essay Writing improves the writing skill on the title given. Developing a story through visualisation brings forth the methodical way of writing in each individual.

Skits, Plays and Dramas show the talent of students in rejuvenating the originality of any work of art. Project Exhibition is conducted every year in all the subjects to explore the talent and the creativity of the students. The students have been encouraged to participate in inter collegiate fest and conferences which enable them to improve their knowledge.

3. Problem solving methodology:

The college has adopted the system of giving assignment on regular basis. Beginning of the academic year, the entire set of activities are planned every month and is reflected in the Calendar of Events. Activities like; mind mapping, brain storming and product launch are conducted along with class room teaching which on the other hand brighten up the interest and enthusiasm. The Placement Cell assists the students in securing internships and projects that provide them an opportunity to learn as they work. Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in education is the subtle mode of education to support, enhance and optimize the delivery of information. RNS First Grade College is very efficient in using the tools of ICT for teaching and learning process. Projectors are fixed in all class rooms to teach any subject for that matter. It is not only visual but it is audio-visual and the students are made to observe very keenly each and every information so that it is registered into the minds of students. The teachers have shown graphical representations, sketches, numerical data, models, etc. The pictorial representations shown on the projectors develop interest among the students. The students are given the assignments and to present it by making use of ICT tools. The topics are related to the subjects of BCOM, BBA and BCA.

Classrooms and laboratories are Wi-Fi enabled to facilitate teachers to directly stream videos. Printers and scanners are available in library. In the COVID-19 pandemic the faculty members have made a swift transition from classroom to online. Platform such as Edmodo, WebEx and MS Teams are used to create virtual classrooms. Audio lectures are created and shared to the students.

The management has provided highly furnished Digital library with computers to make use for academic purpose for both teachers and students related to academic progress. Every staffroom has been sanctioned a computer by the College to upload the marks. Instead of writing and filing any information the more advanced way is to use projectors, computers, laptops, etc which focus on effective teaching and storage of information for a long time.

Students thereby find learning in a technology enhanced environment more stimulating and engaging. Therefore, the ICT based teaching enables teaching, learning, assessment evaluation to be more useful. The students are enriched by this ICT tools and accomplish a great means of achievement individually. The ICT tools are very much required while attending seminars and workshops by the teachers to store the necessary information. The students also make use of the tools to present their prepared topics in their particular subjects. Ultimately it is referred as the most efficient and effective teaching-learning process

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode

Response:

Reforms in continuous internal evaluation

As per the norms of Bangalore University the assessment of students' evaluation in RNS First Grade College is measured mainly by Internal assessment which carries 30 marks for each subject. This includes attendance (5 marks), assignment submission (5 marks) and the Internal test (10 marks) and the Preparatory (10 marks) which is exclusively conducted by the Institution. Finally this is followed by semester scheme University examination for 70 marks.

The internal assessment is described on the college website and students are also informed about the criteria for internal assessment and continuous evaluation during the orientation programme. The Principal gives all the details of marks distribution not only to the students but also to the parents. In the regular classes as well the teacher keeps on mentioning the same from time to time. The Principal holds department meetings to ensure that the classes are held properly, subject portions, assignments are given on time for effective evaluation of the students. The HOD's further supervise the functioning of the department.

The examination committee plays an important role in maintaining the correct record of the students' regularity with performance. After conducting each test, the attendance as well as the marks is displayed on the notice board. This is done periodically. The students make note of it. The same is sent to parents through SMS. The students are required to check and sign their internal assessment marks before it is uploaded on the University portal.

For the continuous evaluation of a student there are few more parameters that are considered like projects, class activities, club activities ('Ignited minds' for BCOM & BBA) and ('Cront' for BCA). Cultural activities are conducted to exuberate the hidden talent and creative skills of students. The cultural events are conducted more in number as per the schedule. Not only academics, cultural even the sports activities are conducted with regard to the overall development of students. Both indoor and outdoor games are conducted in the college. The students are encouraged to participate in inter college cultural as well as sports competitions. It is the pride of RNS First Grade College that the students have brought credit in academics, cultural and sports activities. The achievements of students are enthusiastically recorded in the

college with respective committees. With all the above curriculum both in academics and co-curricular activities, the students improve their level of understanding and thereby their overall performance is improved. The CCEC marks are based on cultural, sports and overall involvement in the activities. This carries 50 marks. This way college has a transparent and continuous internal assessment system.

2.5.2 Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

Response:

Mechanism to deal with Internal Exam related grievances is transparent, time – bound and efficient.

The college has a robust mechanism to ensure that the process of continuous assessment is transparent, efficient and in the best interest of students. Examination reforms are always evolving. The examination reforms have been made by the Examination committee. The college follows the guidelines set by the Bangalore University. The system has two major components one is Internal Assessment and the other is Semester Examination. The college provides all the details of the test and exam in the calendar of events which is given to the students at the beginning of the year. All the students are guided on the procedure to be followed to write the exam. The Internal Test, Preparatory and Semester Exam are systematically conducted by the examination committee.

The Internal assessment system has a key impact of the academic performance of the college. As per the guidelines of the Bangalore University Internal assessment is based on students' attendance, assignment submission and performance in Internal and Preparatory exam. Both the Internal test and Preparatory exam are conducted in strict vigilance and monitored from the CCTV cameras. Students get accustomed to the system and focus their attention towards improving the academic performance.

Evaluation Process:

- Once the test/exam is done the answer scripts are valued by respective subject teachers within the time limit given and the marks are uploaded to the portal.
- The answer scripts are shown to the students and the question paper is discussed in the class.
- The consolidated marks and attendance is displayed on the notice board for the students' reference.
- An SMS is sent to parents with details of marks and attendance.
- If any discrepancies is found it is brought to the notice of the class teacher and HOD and the needful is done in consent with the Principal.
- CCEC marks is kept transparent which is based on overall involvement of the students in various activities, sports and cultural.
- End of the semester the students are called to sign the Internal Assessment marks and only than it is uploaded to the University portal.

- Revaluation is permitted for the regular students. Guidance is given in this regard.
- Absentees with genuine reasons get an opportunity to re-write the test/exam.
- The University exam is also strictly conducted following the protocols of the University with the presence of sit-in-squad.

If a student has a grievance related to marks card, name, initial, register number or exam fee it is recorded in the format available and the needful is done. Along with the academic performance in tests and examinations the students of III year BBA and BCA have been assigned the projects which is a part of academic curriculum. The teacher's guide their respective students in completing the project.

Thus the college ensures transparency in the evaluation process. The reforms have created a positive impact among the students. The transparency of examination phenomena is carried out efficiently by the well-organized examination committee.

The Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (COs), a set of individually assessable outcome-based component provide the potential to acquire competence at appropriate levels and apply them to real-life situations.

As a part of the preparation of POs and COs, the Principal conducts meeting with all the department HOD's for the best results. Once finalised the curriculum objectives are updated on the college website. All the faculty and the students receive a booklet of the syllabi containing POs, PSOs and COs in the beginning of the academic year. The Principal briefs the POs to all the students and parents during the orientation programme and later the HODs and the class teachers brief the COs and PSOs at the department level.

All the activities, programmes and events organised are based on learning outcomes. This reflects in good results, University ranks, placements and the chances to pursue for higher studies. The College initiates the quality improvement program for each department. The subject experts from the University, BOS members and teachers discuss about the prescribed syllabus. .

The College conducts as well as encourages the teaching fraternity to attend workshops, seminars, refresher courses and interactive sessions. These sessions are conducted from the experienced resource persons from the Universities. The course outcomes are generally discussed in the Board of Studies meeting and are structured based on the changes proposed in the syllabus.

Every department projects of either BCOM, BBA or BCA projects the POs, PSOs, and Cos on the department Notice board. The students are regularly guided to know these outcomes. Naturally, teachers of every department interact with the students about the inputs at the end of each program. The program outcomes of all the subjects are clearly made understood to the students.

At the beginning of the unit, teachers modulates on the learning outcomes and program outcome which makes the teaching learning process more effective, its benefits are made aware to the students about the relevance of the topic in their pursuit of knowledge.

The direct assessment of the POs and Cos is monitored through their performance in the test, preparatory and university exams. The indirect method of assessment of the fulfilment of these outcomes is done by the given assignments, presentations to ascertain if they have been able to do what was being intended. The feedbacks are collected from the students at the college level and the review is done on the achievement of the same.

Well-planned discussion is made in each meeting which later reiterates at different levels to the teachers and students. The possibility in relation to these outcomes is also considered. The college organises career counselling lectures for the effective communication.

Attainment of Programme outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the Institution.

The academic programmes offered by the college have a clearly stated learning outcome. The curriculum development has been done taking all the POs into consideration and assuring that the curriculum is strongly aligned with the programme outcomes. It is integrated with the institutional goals and objectives. Assessment of the programme outcomes is done through Direct and Indirect modes. The Direct mode includes the performance at the Internal Assessment test and University examination. The CGPA score is one of the important measures to the extent of fulfilment of the PSOs. The UG programmes follows credit based continuous evaluation system. In this pattern the Internal Assessment marks carries 30 marks and theory is 70 marks. The summative carries 100% weightage.

In the Indirect mode the feedback from the faculty and students towards the academic curriculum are taken as measures for the attainment of PSOs. Alumni feedback is also obtained. The PSOs and COs are also appropriately framed along the lines of the programme outcomes. The assessment primarily aims at continuous assessments and final semester examination.

The colleges follows the guidelines laid by the University. Each semester two Internal Assessment Tests and one Preparatory exam are conducted. The phenomena of program outcomes, program specific outcomes and course outcomes are concerned and being followed, there are certain other measures, which help students to adhere to it and score good marks and also to learn methodical skill based activities.

One such measure is to monitor the students and visualise the performance: Students attendance to all the classes is compulsory and the subject teachers give importance to every child in the class. The absence of students to the class is recorded and the respective parent is informed about the absence through SMS message on the same day. This will help both the parents as well as the college to know what difficulty or problem the student is in. After every Test/Exam the marks list is displayed on the notice board. The question paper is discussed in the class. If the students have any discrepancies than it is resolved by the class teacher with consultation with HOD. It's not only the academia which the college concentrates to build up students' career but also the co-curricular aspects are included in the curriculum.

The Mentor-Mentee system is introduced to all the classes. This division of the class in two groups makes the teachers to understand the student individually so that the actual problems of the student is understood. Students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular extra-curricular activities. Participating in activities makes the student to gets new ideas, learn methods, develops knowledge and also skills.

Students involvement in outreach activities, various extension activities and their performance is monitored and measured by the class teachers to assure that the learning outcomes are achieved out of the respective programmes. Students' involvement in the activities is recorded and marks are allotted which constitutes CCEC marks.

Extension programs are integrated into the curriculum at RNS First Grade College. 4.1 Physical Facilities

4.1.1 The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Response:

Infrastructure facilities are important for effective and efficient conduct of the educational programmers in the institutions.

Classroom:

The college has 22 classrooms. All the classrooms are well ventilated, well-equipped with sufficient number of benches and fans. Seven classrooms are digitalized. Faculties deliver their lectures using projector provided by the college for effective teaching and learning process.

Library:

The college has allotted separate area in second floor for the library. The library has a good collection of books with more than 7998 books. The library subscribes to reputed national and international journals, magazines and 08 daily Kannada and English newspapers. The library uses open source integrated library management software called 'KOHA.' Before this, New Gen Lib software was used. The library also started using institutional repository software called "D-Space.". The library has subscribed e-resources database called N-list and DELNET and has Bangalore University library membership to benefit the users and providing open access resources for the benefit of the users like NDLI, e-PG Patashala, etc.,

Digital library:

Institute provides very informative collections of E-Books, E-Journal, and E-Learning through digital library. Seven Systems are provided with Internet facility and LAN connections.

Departmental Libraries:

In addition to Central Library, all the departments in the college run their own departmental libraries. A separate cabin is issued to each department to maintain department library.

Computer lab:

Around 112 computers are equipped in digital computer lab where lab classes is conducted for BCA, B.Com and BBA students. The available physical infrastructure is optimally utilized regularly along with college hours, to conduct certificate courses like TALLY, PHYTHON, ANDROID and DOTNET.

Business lab:

College has well-furnished business lab for Commerce and Management students. The lab has around 8 computers with updated software like TALLY.

Auditorium:

The college has been facilitated with a well accosted auditorium which has seating capacity of about 1800. The indore stadium with synthetic flooring for Badminton play is an added facility inside the auditorium.

Sports room:

College is facilitated with well-equipped sports room in the basement. Carom, chess, table tennis, and badminton etc are all part of indoor sports activity. For outdoor field events college has been facilitated with grounds for cricket, football and Basketball.

Cafeteria:

The College has provided a platform for cafeteria at the college basement. Cafeteria place is maintained hygienically and can accommodate more than 100 people at once.

Placement cell:

College provides wonderful opportunity for students to get themselves placed in good reputed companies. Training is given to the students to enhance their skill of aptitude, reasoning and logical thinking. A separate room for group discussion is provided.

RNS First Grade College Library Management System helps in easy search and location of books. The library holds 7998 books, subscribing reputed journals, magazines and also subscribing to 08 daily Kannada and English newspapers. Bound volumes are available for the utilization of users. The library is also subscribing to different types of online information resources for their user community 1. National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for scholarly content (N-List), 2. Developing Library Network (DELNET), and National Digital Library of India.

The library started using open source library management software called KOHA in 2018 for its smooth functioning of circulation operations in the library. After the implementation of KOHA, the library staff and users can now have more advanced functionalities. Before this, we were using another open-source software called Newgenlib software.

The library staff has started printing barcode labels, which eased library staff by saving time so they can now provide other services in a limited time. Additionally, with their report module's help, library staff can get a variety of library statistics. The report module provides both onscreen and in a CSV format. After implementation, the library users have OPAC functionalities. Through OPAC interface, users can now search in the library catalogue and get the current availability status of books. KOHA provides two

types of search facilities.

1. Simple search,
2. Advanced search. Boolean logic can be used in advanced searches to narrow down the search. The search result can be sorted in ascending and descending order according to the Title, Author, Publisher, call Number, and ISBN. KOHA helps the library staff in giving quality services to its users.

4.3 IT Infrastructure

A dedicated internet connectivity of bandwidth 500 Mbps (1:1) is provided by ACT India Fiber Net Pvt. Ltd. The institution is Wi-Fi enabled to promote digital flow.

Faculty and students can avail the Wi-Fi facilities. Internet facility is provided in all the classrooms, laboratories, offices, seminar hall and, library. Wherever high speed connectivity is required wired connection through optical cable LAN services are provided to the computer lab and office. A dedicated digital library center with 7 desktops are provided for browsing & accessing e-resources besides computer labs. Institution has a provision for internet registered under the domain name www.rnsfgc.edu.in. to access its own email facility for staff and students. Immunity is provided against cyber-attacks.

Our Institution is very keen on updating IT facilities such as internet bandwidth, the configuration of computers, LCD projectors, ICT facilities etc., to provide state of the art of infrastructure for the teaching-learning process. At the beginning of the academic year the requirement for replacement and updating of existing IT accessories and the purchase of new equipment is collected from each department.

Wi-Fi facility is provided to all HODs and faculty cabins. At present, the institute has 150 systems in various laboratories to meet the requirements of curriculum and content beyond the curriculum to make them contemporary and industry-ready. Currently, the configuration of computers is upgraded significantly to i3 for technological advancements. In addition to this, all the computers are with LCD monitors. In order to provide security from unauthorized users antivirus is installed in the systems. There are scanners cum printers available for usage. The Exam branch has a high-speed multi tray scanner cum printer. A scanner cum printer is available in Principal, Vice Principal, and administrative office room. A laser printer is

available in the office to take printouts. Computer labs with the latest software and Internet facility are available to the students. Hardware and software updating is in line with the demand of the latest syllabus as well as students' feedback.

CCTV cameras have been installed in all the prominent and required venues to achieve 24x7 campus surveillance. Since the IT field is continuously evolving at a faster pace, the dedicated network team is focused on upgrading the IT facilities so as to provide the best of the facility to the students. The maintenance of computers, and installation of software are done by programmers whereas, hardware and internet related issues are handled by hardware and networking professionals.

The supportive facilities on the campus are developed to contribute to the effective ambience for curricular, extra- curricular and administrative activities. A provision of expenditure in the budget is made annually by the management for the maintenance and replenishment of physical facilities which will ensure their availability on a continual basis.

For the needs of better society by imparting skill-based education through effective teaching-learning process through technically advanced educational tools, management spreads its helping hand every year. Since the inception every academic year, needed-assessment for replacement / up-gradation / addition of the existing infrastructure which is carried out based on the suggestions from higher authorities, Institution Head, Heads of the departments, administration department after reviewing course requirements, student computer ratio, budget constraints, working condition of the existing equipment and also student's grievances are carried out. The requirements regarding classrooms, laboratories, infrastructure development and other equipment are also planned by governing body of the college led by the Principal.

The college has formulated a policy for the maintenance of infrastructure and services. Day to day maintenance and care is taken by the administration office, in consultation with the Principal. Overall functioning of facilities and services are monitored at regular basis. The absolute and essential requirements of minor expenses of maintenance or replacement or construction are immediately sanctioned in the meetings. Optimal deployment of infrastructure is ensured through conducting awareness programs/training programs for the faculty on the use of new technology. Effective utilization of infrastructure is ensured through appointment of adequate and well qualified lab technicians/system administrator and housekeeping staff.

College is well equipped with around 75 CCTV camera for safety purpose. Regular maintenance of the camera is done. Separate cabin is arranged for vigilance of CCTV camera. System backups are maintained regularly by office staff

CLASSROOM FACILITIES:

22 well-furnished and well ventilated classrooms are there in RNS First Grade College. Classrooms are allotted as per the students' strength. Time to time maintenance is done. Colouring and pest control have been done, whenever required. Seven classrooms provide ICT facilities for better teaching.

DIGITAL LAB:

RNS First Grade College provides Digital lab facility for students and staff with Wi-Fi enabled in the whole lab. The available physical infrastructure is optimally utilized within the college hours, to conduct certificate courses like TALLY, PHYTHON, ANDROID, DOTNET. Added to this, Campus Recruitment Training classes, campus recruitments, meetings and seminars are held.

BUSINESS LAB:

RNS First Grade College has well-furnished business lab for commerce and management students. This lab provides a platform for students to conduct commerce and business related activity. The lab has around 8 computers with updated software like TALLY.

NETWORK FACILITY:

College is well facilitated with Internet. WiFi facility is enabled for entire campus. Computers are enabled with high speed LAN connectivity. ACT fiber net connection serves the internet.

STAFF ROOM:

Faculty members are provided with good ambience with separate cabins and with an atmosphere very conducive for regular interaction with the students, who come for counselling, guidance and clarifications. Each department is given staffroom at different floors. Systems are provided with Internet facility for every staffroom.

AUDITORIUM:

Campus is unique in itself with a massive auditorium that has seating capacity of 1800 people at a time. It is well-known for its amazing, well planned structure with sound proof interiors at its best, inits dazzling illumination. An indoor stadium with synthetic flooring for badminton play inside the auditorium is an added facility.

SEMINAR HALL:

Institution has provided well-furnished seminar hall with projector facilities to conduct seminars, workshops, department activities etc. Seminar hall also contains desks to promote digital teaching.

LIBRARY FACILITY

The library has a good collection of books with more than 7998 books. The library subscribes to reputed national, international journals and magazines for the library's users and has also subscribed to 08 daily Kannada and English newspapers for the academic community. The library uses open source integrated library management system software called 'KOHA'. Earlier NewGenLib software was used. The library also started using institutional repository software called "DSpace". .DSpace is used for creating open

access repositories for scholarly and published digital content. The library has subscribed e-resources database called N-list and DELNET and has Bangalore University library membership to benefit the users that provides open access resources for the benefit of the users like NDLI, e-PG Patashala, etc.,

SPORTS FACILITIES:

College provides the best area for many sports. Separate grounds surrounded by greenery for the games like cricket, volleyball, badminton, basketball, kho-kho, kabaddi, throwball and shuttle badminton are in the campus. Every year minimum of 3 students represent Bangalore University for all India Inter University Tournament in various disciplines.

WATER TANKS:

Water tank is cleaned at regular intervals. Maintenance is done on time. Clean and purified drinking water is provided. The water tank is cleaned at regular intervals.

HEALTH AND HYGIENE:

Housekeeping staff is appointed to maintain cleanliness and hygienic conditions including classrooms, seminar hall, auditorium, computer lab, staff room, office, library, corridor, washrooms. First aid kit is available in the sports room of the institution.

CAMPUS SECURITY:

CCTV camera are installed in the campus to provide utmost security and prohibit malpractices. Security guards are appointed in the campus.

Organizational structure of our institution:

The College was established in the year 2012 with an objective to enlighten the students with technical, social, and cultural knowledge and provide them with ample opportunities for their overall progress. Our institution undoubtedly plays a pivotal role in sculpting the learners, but it requires that inside fire which should remain smoldering.

The Principal's supportive initiatives help to effectively orient the academic activities of the institution. The institutional Governance is made effective by a decentralized and participative management. The institution has well-formed rules and regulations for the recruitment, promotion, and established service rules.

As per the constitution of the Trust, Board of Trust is the primary executive, endorsed with all academic and administrative responsibilities. The members of the trust manage its activities.

The Principal guides the college in academic progress, admission, staff recruitment and administrative matters. The evaluation process is monitored by the Controller of Examinations. HoDs are responsible for the preparation of Department timetable, work allocation among teachers, review of Teachers' Diary and

submission of various reports to the Principal and IQAC. Class teachers and Mentors are assigned for each class to ensure personal care, attention, guidance, counselling, evaluation, and assessment of each student in the class.

Bare-foot counselling by subject teachers/value education teachers/ mentors address student grievances. Suggestion box is kept at the entrance of the college block. In addition, the student grievances are also addressed at the department level by respective teachers and HODs. The recruitment of the staff happens based on the minimum criteria set by the trust. The Trust has enacted a by-law for the institution in the form of Compendium which defines the service rules. All the staff are aware about the Administrative and Service Manual available in the institution. Faculties are educated about conditions of service, roles and responsibilities, discharge of duties, increments, kinds of leave, code of conduct, re-imbusement for attending FDP. The institution runs for 7 ½ hours. The teaching and non-teaching faculty have the benefits of PF, ESI, Casual Leaves, and Maternity leaves etc. Recruitment is taken place according to the norms of the University, a body comprising of the Principal, HOD and Subject experts decides the worthiness of the faculty member by his/her performance in the interview according to the parameters they are looking for. Faculty who joins the institution is on probationary period for a year. The promotions are based on overall performance in the Institution and the Management also applies its discretion.

6.3.5 Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff

Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff:

Our Institution has a performance appraisal system for all teaching and non-teaching staff. The college collects feedback of faculty members from students through a specified format.

To strengthen the academic environment of the institution IQAC meets regularly and discusses academic, administrative, and other aspects of the institution. Performance Appraisal aids in deciding the future

course of action for the institution in terms of development, recognition and sharing the responsibilities of the college. All the teaching and non-teaching staff must submit self-appraisal form to the Principal at the end of the year. Teaching faculty performance is reviewed based on student results, punctuality, commitment, teaching skills, number of papers presented, number of conferences and workshops attended, research projects undertaken and involvement in other college activities. Faculty performance is also assessed by Principal, Vice Principal, HOD and Management. Students' feedback on teachers and teaching learning process are reviewed with utmost importance. All self-appraisal forms are scrutinized by the Principal. The Principal evaluates performance based on the following key parameters:

1. Results (average of all the subjects handled in previous academic year).
2. Professional Improvement – paper presented and published, books published, participation in seminars and workshops.
3. General behaviour and attitude, regularity and punctuality, leaves availed; then initiative to take the responsibility, team work, supervisory skills, learning ability, quality of work, productivity and contribution to institutional growth.
4. Outstanding achievement, university ranks, additional qualifications like NET, SLET, MPhil, Ph.D., or any other distinguished achievement - personal or institutional.
5. The Principal helps to empower the faculty with required skills and expertise by deputing to faculty training programme when needed.
6. Faculty's personal interaction with the Principal helps the management in understanding the achievements, limitations of the faculties and to decide benefits for the teachers.
7. Based on the appraisal performance faculty members whose performance is below average are called upon to meet the Principal individually. The Principal discusses about the reasons for under-performance and help to remove such bottlenecks. High performers are appreciated.
8. The process of evaluating self-appraisal form every year helps faculties to involve in many activities and evolve as a competitive teacher.
9. The Principal meets periodically the Heads and faculty members of all departments and discusses their performances.
10. At the end of each semester, the students are required to provide feedback on the classes taken by the faculty. The students provide feedback on the teaching skills and the process of teaching. This feedback is one of the major points of consideration in the evaluation of the staff.
11. The overall performance of the faculty is considered on the performance of the students, academic improvement of the faculty, the appraisal process etc are taken for the evaluation of the faculty.
12. The Non-teaching faculty are assessed based on attitude towards public, co-workers, staff/student relation, job performance, proactiveness, behaviour towards supervisor.
13. Non-teaching staff is also required to give self-appraisal at the end of the year to the Principal.

Internal Audit

Internal audit of the institution is carried out regularly by the members of the Internal Financial Audit Committee. Over the span of Internal Audit, all the required steps are taken to regularize the accounts, to obtain confirmations for the credit balances, to collect documentary evidences. The main source of income and the different types of expenses/payments which are recorded, scrutinized and audited by the Internal Financial Audit Committee are:

External Audit

External Audit is conducted by the auditors of BC Shetty and Co., at the end of the every financial year (BC Shetty and Co., - Firm Registration No. 003819S). The auditors visit the college at regular intervals, they verify all the financial transactions with the supporting documents and approval of proper authority for each financial transaction. Based on the accounts and records submitted by the Internal Financial Audit Committee, the firm conducts the external audit and the final audit report with audit findings that are submitted to the Management. Audit is conducted in accordance with the auditing standards generally accepted in India.

After reviewing the report, the management instructs the concerned section to rectify the errors to set right the audit objections. No audit objections have been identified so far, since the institution follows a good system of internal controls.

During the course of external audit, the following points are verified by an auditor:

- Assets register should be verified considering grants on the purchase of assets.

- Verification of depreciation should be done according to useful life of assets or as per the companies Act, whichever is applicable.
- All the relevant necessities of law ought to be satisfied for the acquisition of investments and fixed assets.
- Fees and charges received from tuition fees, admission fees, examination fees, sports fees should be checked based on the affirmed fees structure.
- Counterfoil copies of receipt book and fees register should be verified with the cash book.
- Purchase bills, quotations, inward registers and bills received from service providers should be verified with water charges, telephone charges, electricity charges, purchase of sports items, stationery and printing charges. The authorized persons should authorize all the purchases.
- Verification of Provident Fund: The collected Provident Fund should be deposited in the appropriate Government accounts within time without any default. These could be verified with relevant bank challans.
- Appropriate provision should be made on outstanding payments.

- Infrastructural facilities including physical facilities, ICT facilities, library facility with ICT integration to be intensified.
- Women Empowerment and Grievance Redressal Cell to encourage student council activities.
- To conduct sports and cultural interclass competition.
- Continuous practice of decentralized and Participative Governance with faculty performance evaluation through self-appraisal forms and confidential reports

REVIEW OF TEACHING AND LEARNING PROCESS THROUGH IQAC:

The IQAC periodically reviews the teaching methodologies to ensure quality teaching. The IQAC takes initiatives to implement innovative methods in teaching to facilitate the faculty for the up-dation of their

knowledge. Subject allotment is done at the beginning of every semester by the Principal in consultation with the IQAC and the Heads of various departments. Our college adheres to academic calendar for the conduction of continuous- comprehensive evaluation system as per the guidelines of the Bangalore University. Following this the faculty prepares lesson plans and methodologies which they use to process their respective curriculum. The IQAC mandates the examination committee to conduct two internal tests and one preparatory exam during the semester. The Institution Mentoring system has been introduced to establish a better and effective student- teacher relationship and guide the students academically.

The two examples of institutional reviews and implementation of teaching-learning reforms facilitated by the IQAC are listed below:

1. CALENDAR OF EVENTS:

Our college adheres to the academic calendar for the conduction of continuous evaluation system as per the guidelines of the Bangalore University. IQAC of our college is viewed as a coordinating and facilitating organ among the various wings of the college with an objective to assure quality and excellence. In the process of quality initiatives, IQAC pragmatically contributes to the improvement, enhancement, and further development of teaching- learning process. Inaugural event on the first day of the academic year is undertaken religiously every year to welcome the first-year students to the RNS First Grade College. The day begins with an orientation programme on a chosen theme which usually focuses on teaching-learning pedagogies. The calendar of events of the college encompasses National festivals like Independence Day, Teachers Day, Gandhi Jayanthi, Republic Day, Blood Donation Festival and Annual Day. IQAC confirms the participation of teachers in orientation and refresher programmes apart from the academic programmes organized by the college. For the creation of environment awareness in the students of the college; NSS Programme Officer Prof. Jagadeesh K N guides them to plant a sapling. **'Each One Plant One'** is the slogan for the promotion of Green Environment in and around the college. Calendar of Events include all the activities including NSS. The events are well planned. Swatch Bharath campaign is also promoted along with Gandhi Jayanthi celebration to create civic sense of 'Clean and Healthy Environment' with the green look around. Activities like visit to old age home and orphanage home is added to create sense of family and social responsibility among the students. Tests and Exam dates are also a part of calendar of event. Two Internals and one Preparatory exam is conducted which benefits the students' academic performance. Class activities and club activities are also a part of COE. To add to it the students have been motivated to join all the extra-curricular and club activities for their overall development.

2. MENTORING SYSTEM:

In our institution, Mentoring system has been introduced to establish a better and effective student-teacher relationship and guide the students in academic matters. The Class Teachers and Mentors monitor the academic performance of the students. They also interact frequently with the students to understand and assist any student with issues that affect their ability to learn or is impeding their academic success. Learning levels of the students are systematically analysed through the test administered to the students. Based on the test performance and involvement in other activities students are classified into slow learners and advanced learners. All the Class Teachers along with the mentors take part in improving the students allotted to them. Students meet their mentor on regular basis to seek guidance and in turn mentors take the students into confidence. Development of mentoring system promotes interactions between the student and the faculty member. It helps in gauging the learning levels of students and taking appropriate steps in this regard, subsequently extra classes were introduced to improve them. Proper care and support are ensured to the slow learners through counseling. Periodic reviews of their performance are undertaken. Advanced

learners were recognized and were advised to present Power Point Presentations on different topics. They were encouraged to get high ranks in the University list.

The entire mentoring system has brought about a healthy relationship between the faculty members and the students. The frequent one to one communication between the two has helped the faculty members in gauging the students and planning for student specific plans to improve their academic achievements. During the online academic session 2020-21; exclusively, a special one to one online counselling session was conducted by the Principal, Dr. Sudheer Pai K L, to all the students through MS Teams, focusing upon the overall discipline of the students like proper utilization of time, study habits, code of conduct, health, and extra-curricular need for the formation of the personality and preparation for examinations. Class wise counselling sessions were arranged in batches. 35 batches with a total number of 1083 students were offered individual counselling by our Principal. The parents of the students were also made part of the counseling session. The focus of the counseling session by our Principal during the even semester 2020-21 was on the problems faced by the students during examinations like fear, lack of concentration, time management and failure. During the counseling sessions, our Principal provided suggestions and guidance to all the students to excel in their academics and to improve the skills. He guided the students to develop self-awareness and overcome anxiety & stress. He urged the students not to make decisions based on family expectations and peer pressure. He also encouraged the students to understand themselves and the issues that trouble them and guided them to resolve their problems like personal, emotional, social, family, peer, academic etc. The sessions were very informative and enriching for students as well as parents.

Safety & Security

Our Institution workplace guarantees equality in both genders. At present women count has increased in all the fields. Our college always has more number of female faculties and girls than male faculties and boys. College gives high priority towards safety and security of girls. Every day at the main entrance, the students are checked for identity card to enter the campus and a record is maintained of visitors with timings in the reception of the college building. A security staff is appointed in the institution through trusted and well-known agencies. The security is strict and does not permit any student without helmet, on ride. The students are instructed to use pedestrian pathway to walk. If students are absent on the working day of the college, immediately a mobile message is sent to their parents.

CCTV surveillance covers all the locations in and around the campus i.e. each class, office, staffroom, corridors, parking area, auditorium, canteen etc. All cameras are installed in the college premises which provides 24 hours surveillance.

Anti-Sexual Harassment cell is formed in the Institution to address the complaints filed by the girl students and lady faculty members. Complaint box and suggestion boxes are set in the college campus which is placed near the Principal cabin. The students are free to drop the complaints and suggestions in the boxes. It helps especially girls; regarding any abuse or harassment.

To conduct any activity or rally outside the campus, our college takes prior permission letter from nearby police station. The college maintains the stock of necessary items for emergency medical treatment. A napkin vending machine is also provided for girl students, in times of need.

If incase of any medical emergency, the college provides a car with a driver or if needed ambulance services for the students and staff. The ambulance vehicle is parked near the entrance of Administrative building.

Fire safety equipments are installed in the ground floor of the building. Proper knowledge regarding the usage of equipment is also given to all the staff members. The college has well sophisticated compound, covering the whole campus for campus security.

Counseling

The main mission of RNS First Grade College is to mould the character and the behavior of the students to enlighten their careers.

We have mentor system for each class; two mentors are allotted for each class and for each mentor, 40 students are assigned. Mentors identify students field of interest, passion, strength, weakness, challenges and also encourage them. They also identify the students, who undergo stress, depression, anxiety and many more due to varied aspects.

Common room

The college has separate common rooms for boys and girls with modern amenities like first aid box, glucose etc. There are female supporting staffs who ensure the safety of girls and also maintain cleanliness in common rooms.

Energy conservation strategies to be adopted like the use of LED bulbs in the First Grade College building and also for the Plastic-free campus, usage of bio-degradable materials to be encouraged. Swatch Bharath Abhiyan is practised in the college to create awareness of cleanliness and consciousness amongst students. Our Management is environment- friendly. Apart from the utility area, the whole campus is covered with plants and trees. More than 50% of our campus is filled with greens as shown in the pictures. 'Each one plant one' is the strategy followed to have greenery around.

Waste Management;

Human activities always generate waste. This was not a major issue when human population was relatively small and nomadic. But it became a serious concern with urbanisation and growth of large contribution. Poor management of waste led to contamination of water, soil and air and had major impact on public health. Waste can be solid, liquid or gaseous and each type has different methods of disposal and management. Waste management deals with all types of waste, including industrial, biological and household.

Solid Waste Management

Remember the phrase 'Reduce, Reuse, Recycle' is in that order for a reason !

Our college adopts the policy of reduce, recycle and reuse. College has enough staff inside and outside the building for collection of dry waste. In each class room, floor, office and lab, dustbins are provided. Every day, morning and evening emptying of dustbins is being done on regular basis and library has huge paper

waste such as old books, magazines and newspapers etc. All these are considered as solid waste.

Liquid Waste Management;

The college has STP (EFFLUENT TREATMENT PLANT) for treating the liquid waste which is generated in the canteen, college sink, and wash room. There are two sump tanks. The description of the sump tanks are as follows:

Sump tank No.1: Height: 12',Length: 38',Width: 12'

This plant has purification capacity of 1, 53,000 litres/per day

Sump tank No.2: Height: 25', Length: 12', Width: 12'.

That water which is adversely affected in quality due to human activity and contains urine, faeces, food materials, oil, dissolved soap, chemicals and other contaminants is waste water. This is utilised for creating rich humans for the college garden and lawn.

Title of the practice 1: Blood Donation Festival

RNS First Grade College celebrates Blood Donation Festival once in a year with the tagline *“Donate Blood, Save Life”*

1. Objectives:

- To save human lives.
- To create awareness and motivate students and other people towards blood donation.
- To help a person, in case of any requirement of blood.
- To inculcate the practice of blood donation among college students on regular basis.
- To build awareness about the advantages of donating blood.
- To extend hands to serve the society by fulfilling the requirement of blood.
- To raise awareness, that individuals can save lives and improve the health of others by donating blood.
- To encourage people to donate blood voluntarily without compensation.

1. The Context: Donating blood is significant in a country like India because, every two seconds in a day, a person needs blood. Since blood cannot be manufactured outside the body and has a limited life; the supply must constantly be replenished by generous blood donors. The people who donate blood are life savers. When donate is donated, it helps people to be cured of their blood disorders

and save lives. However, 37% of the population is eligible to donate blood, yet only 5% actually do. Therefore promoting the practice of blood donation is the need of the time. In this perspective, RNS First Grade College has taken a great initiative to save lives by donating blood under the name “Jeevamrutha”. The Institution supports the needy people to fight against their health disorders. With every blood donation, we are providing strength, hope and courage to patients and their families.

2. **The Practice:** The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of RNS First Grade College headed by Prof. Jagadish K N, with the support of Principal Dr. Sudheer Pai K L and Vice Principal Prof. Shilpa Sarnad has been practising the blood donation camp once in a year to help the needy in the society.

- **2015-16:** The NSS Unit of RNS First Grade College in association with the Red Cross Society organized a blood donation camp in the college premises on 7th October 2015. Dr. Sunil V. Nayak (MBBS, DCP) of Red Cross, was the Chief Guest. The day ended with the collection of 110 units of blood.
- **2016-17:** RNS First Grade College with its NSS unit and RNS Pre University College in collaboration with Rotary Club conducted Blood donation festival on 20th February 2017. The Chief Guest Sri Shyam Sunadar Kadur, Principal of Jnanakshi Education Institution, and Co-ordinator of Rastrothana Blood Bank inaugurated the festival. The wing commander Sri Dwarakanath and Mrs. Nagarathna Dwarakanath, the Retired Principal of Jnanakshi Institution, congratulated the NSS volunteers for having organised an event of social benefit. Around 182 units of blood was collected.
- **2017-18:** RNS First Grade College in collaboration with RNS Pre University College and Lions Club Bangalore South organised Blood donation festival on 1st February 2018 at RNS First Grade College block. The event was inaugurated by the Chief Guest Dr Shivashankar, Director of RNSIT. Teaching and non-teaching staff, students, volunteers and parents took active participation in the festival. Around 300 units of blood was collected.
- **2018-19:** RNS First Grade College in collaboration with RNS Pre University College and Lions Club Bangalore South organised Blood donation festival on 14th February 2019. The occasion was inaugurated by the Chief Guest Dr Jagadish, M D, Paediatrics and Sri Vasanth Madhav, Secretary of SAKSHAM. The day ended with a collection of 408 units of blood.
- **2019-20:** RNS First Grade College in collaboration with RNS Pre University College and Lions Club Bangalore South organised BLOOD DONATION FESTIVAL on 14th February 2020. The Chief Guests of the event were Dr. Mathangi J, Senior Consultant, Radiation Oncologist, BGS Gleneagles Global Hospitals and Sri Jayadeva Kamath, Treasurer, SAKSHAM. Students enthusiastically participated in the camp and around 475 units of blood was collected by Lion’s Club, Bangalore South, Rashthrothana Blood Bank, Indira Gandhi Institute of child Health Hospital Blood Bank, Kidwai and Red Cross Blood Bank.

1. **Evidence of Success:** RNS First Grade College has been practising the habit of donating blood through Blood Donation Festival since 2015-16 as a part of its responsibilities. The college gives due importance to encouraging students and the surrounding community to donate blood to save lives. After implementing the Blood donation festival as the best practice, the college has observed successful outcomes in an increased number of donors in the last five years. The Institution witnessed the gradual increase in the number of blood units collected from 110 units to 475 units.

1. **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** In spite of awareness created amongst the students about blood donation, we have found difficulty in the number of people who volunteered

blood donation. Many volunteers who were interested in donating blood were deprived of donating blood because of not meeting the required criteria like less HB count, menstrual issues and other health problems. This resulted in less units of blood collected than the target by the Institution.

Title of the practice 2: International yoga Day

1. Objectives:

- To inculcate the awareness of Yoga benefits.
- To educate people about the various means of overcoming stress naturally without resorting to any artificial medicine.
- To make the practice of yoga popular among students.
- To eliminate all types of negativity from the lives of students.
- To spread peace in the young minds.
- To make students get used to meditation through yoga.
- To connect people through International Yoga Day.
- To create awareness about the holistic benefits of yoga.
- To imbibe the value of discipline in the minds of students.

1. The Context: Present generation is becoming weak and unhealthy day by day due to ignorance, wrong practice and laziness. Yoga is an ancient practice originated from India. This practice is 5000-year-old which heals our mind, body and soul and we can say that yoga reforms our thoughts to pursue a great lifestyle. RNS First Grade College has adopted a holistic approach towards education by celebrating International Yoga Day through practice of yoga by a large number of students and by organising WALKATHON/YOGATHON in and around Channasandra and Raja Rajeshwari Nagar. Experts from the field are invited to conduct yoga sessions for the students and staff. Regular yoga and meditation classes are also conducted.

1. The Practice: RNS First Grade College conducts a rally every year under the name WALKATHON/YOGATHON to create awareness in people about the importance of yoga. The Institution takes it as a responsibility to spread right practice from time to time to make everyone 'Healthy, Happy and Harmonious'. The College also organises Yoga practice to students and faculty members under the guidance of an expert in the field every year. **Yogathon** is one of the key events which help all age groups to inspire themselves and experience synergy within the event. This event also inspires everyone to increase their confidence, fitness and instigate them towards health and selflessness.

2015-16: The Institution has organised YOGATHON on the occasion of 'World Yoga Day' on June 21st 2016 to inspire a healthy lifestyle and fitness. There was an overwhelming response with more than 500 students enthusiastically participating in this event.

2016-17: RNS First Grade College has conducted YOGATHON to create awareness about the importance of yoga on 10th July 2017. More than 600 students, faculty members and the public took part in this event.

2017-18: RNS First Grade College in coordination with RNS Pre University College and RNSIT celebrated WORLD YOGA DAY on 21st June 2017. Mr. Rajesh Achari, an expert yoga performer and a representative from NSS unit, with his team members Mr Praveen Shetty, Mr Naveen and Mr Santhosh presented a few popular yoga asanas to attendees. Around 1800 students assembled for the yoga session.

More than 800 students, faculty members and the public took part in the Yogathon-Walkathon rally.

2018-19: RNS First Grade College had organised YOGATHON on 09th July 2018. More than 900 students, faculty members and the public took part in this event.

2019-20: RNS First Grade College had conducted **YOGATHON** to create awareness in people about the importance of yoga on 18th July 2019. The event was organised under the tagline “Yoga for Life”. It was conducted under the guidance of our Principal Dr. Sudheer Pai K.L. More than 1018 students, faculty members and public took part in this event.

2020-21: RNS First Grade College has conducted online Yoga classes for students. Faculty cum yoga trainers of our college are training the students to inculcate in themselves yoga practice every day. The class is conducted in the morning for 30 minutes.

1.Evidence of success: The Institution celebrates International Yoga day by conducting yoga sessions to students by experts in the field and organises a rally under the title WALKATHON by students and faculty members in the surrounding locality for about 6 kilometres to create awareness about the importance of yoga for healthy life. Around 1000 participants are present in the event every year including students and faculties.

Holistic education through old age and orphanage visit:

Holistic education through Kumba mela: Kumbha Mela is the congregation of millions of people on the bank of sacred rivers, who gather from all around the world without any invitation to participate in the stream of knowledge and spirituality. We are indeed proud to say that; eight students of NSS under the guidance and leadership of Prof Jagadish K.N, served as volunteers for seven days in the spiritual event , in NETRA KUMBHA 2019.In such tremendous event our students served almost 2,22,222 devotees ,which has now become a Guinness world record.

Holistic education through Donation to flood victims: As Kodagu and Kerala were badly affected by disastrous flood; hence victims had to be taken care of with food and other prerequisites. RNS First Grade College with support of RNS Pre University, RNS International School and with the help of students and staff members had collected Rs.2 lakhs and contributed Rs.1 Lakh of relief fund to each damage domain to help the needy at the time of havoc.
